Enroll your device by downloading the beta profile, which can be found here. 4. Head to Settings > General > Software update and then you should see the iOS 14 beta available for download. Press the "Download and Install" button. 5. After the beta has been downloaded, your device will reboot. Once it boots up again, it will be running the beta software.1. Remember that backup we made you do? Well, it's the cornerstone of downgrading from iOS 13. 2. Connect your device to a computer and launch iTunes. 3. Put your phone into recovery mode: On an iPhone 8 or later: Press and quickly release the Volume Up button. Press and quickly release the Volume Down button. Then, press and hold the Side button until you see the recovery-mode screen. On an iPhone 6s and earlier, iPad, or iPod touch: Press and hold the Sleep/Wake and Home buttons at the same time. How to Hide Pages in iOS 14 You can now hide your home pages in iOS 14 by tapping and holding any app until you see a drop-down menu appear. Then select Edit Home Screen and tap the dots that appear at the bottom of your screen. Finally, uncheck the pages that you want to hide and tap Done. Then, when you swipe left on your Home Screen, you won't see those pages anymore. With this new feature, you can remove all the apps from your Home Screen that you don't use very often, without having to delete any of them. You can unhide those pages at any time by going back to Edit Home Screen. Then select the dots that appear at the bottom of your screen, and check the pages that you want to unhide. With iOS, it's easy to find any of your installed apps using the new App Library feature. All you have to do is swipe left past your last Home Screen, and you will see all your apps grouped in categories. The new App Library also has a helpful search bar at the top, which makes it easy for you to find any app on your iPhone. Tapping it shows you a list of all your apps in alphabetical order. You can also search for apps by name to narrow down the list. To add widgets to your Home Screen in iOS 14, tap and hold any app until you see a drop-down menu appear. Then select Edit Home Screen and tap the plus sign in the top-left corner of your screen. Finally, select a widget, pick a size, and select Add Widget. You can also combine several widgets in one space by dragging and dropping them on top of each other. However, you have to select two widgets that are the same size for this to work. This will allow you to scroll through several widgets, without taking up too much room on your screen. With iOS 14, you can choose from lots of different widgets that come in three sizes. These widgets are like shortcuts to certain apps on your iPhone, but they also show you live information. For example, the Calendar app widget shows you your upcoming meetings, while the Weather app widget shows you the forecast. The battery widget is a welcome addition to any iPhone 11 users, since the most recent iPhones don't show your battery percentage on the Home Screen anymore. This widget will also show you the battery life of your wireless headphones or any other connected Bluetooth devices. There's also a news widget that cycles through the most popular stories in Apple News. You can also change the news widget to show stories centered around certain topics, like technology or US politics. You can even enter your own topic, as long there are enough stories on Apple News on the subject. There's also a Music widget that lets you play your most recent albums with a single tap, and a Photos widget that lets you put your most prized photos on your Home Screen. Plus, the Maps widget displays your frequently visited locations, so you can quickly get directions to work from your Home Screen. Apple also introduced a feature in iOS 14 that lets you watch videos or have FaceTime calls while using other apps. The new Picture in Picture mode takes a video that's playing on your screen and moves it to the corner, where it is less distracting. This is a perfect feature for anyone who wants to multitask while video chatting or watching videos. To use the new picture in picture mode, simply tap the video and then select the icon with a big rectangle turning into a smaller rectangle. You can then close the app you're using or move the video to another corner of your screen by tapping and dragging it. With Picture in Picture mode, you can pause the video, fast forward, rewind, close it, or bring it back to full screen. However, this feature does not appear to work with YouTube videos at this point, at least the public beta version. With iOS 14, you can "pin" certain contacts to the top of your Messages app. This will put their profile picture at the top of your Messages app, so you don't have to search for them every time you want to text someone. To pin a contact in the Messages app, tap and hold their icon in the app and select Pin (Contact Name). You can also swipe right on their last message and tap the yellow thumbtack icon. To unpin a contact, tap and hold their pinned profile picture and select Unpin (Contact Name). However, you can only pin 9 contacts at once, so make sure to pick the people that you text a lot. If you've been using the same password for different websites and apps on your iPhone, you'll love the new Security Recommendations feature in iOS 14. This feature will tell you when you're using the same password to log in to different websites and apps on your iPhone. Using a different password for your apps will make it a lot harder for hackers to steal your personal information, such as your bank details. This feature can also tell you when your passwords are too easy to guess, or when your passwords have been leaked. Apple will let you know if your login credentials were found in a database of recent security breaches. If hackers were able to steal your username and password, you will be given recommendations about how to make a new password. To use the new Security Recommendations in iOS 14, go to Settings > Passwords. Then select Security Recommendations to see your high priority risks. Next, scroll down and tap Download Profile. You will see this under the Sub-headline that says, Install profile. Then make sure to click Allow when you see the pop-up message. Next, tap another web browser, and you will see this in the top-right corner of your screen. If you do not see this, you can close Safari and go to Settings > Profile Downloaded and tap the downloaded profile. Then enter your passcode. This is the same passcode that you use to open your iPhone when you turn it on. Follow the on-screen instructions and tap Restart in the pop-up. Once your iPhone restarts, open Settings. Look! I've just installed iOS 14 Beta on my Apple iPhone X! If you're an adventurous and hardcore Apple iPhone user who owns any of those models, though, you can already download and install iOS 14 Developer Beta on your handset as early as now. By doing so, you can be more familiar with everything that the software upgrade comes with even before your friends get to experience it. Now, isn't that cool? The iOS 14 Beta Installation procedure is easy but it's rather tricky. Let me give you a step-by-step guide on how to do it right. 1. Connect to a fast and reliable WiFi or Mobile Data network. Side Note: Make sure that your supported iPhone has enough storage left to accommodate the upgrade files that weigh around 4.13GB in total. I recommend having around 8 to 10GB of free space prior to the upgrade just to be safe. 2. Open your iPhone's Safari Web Browser 3. Browse to www.BetaProfiles.com 4. After the website has finished downloading the profile configuration, go to your iPhone's Settings. Click on General and go to "Profile" section (just below VPN). There, you will see "iOS 14 Beta Software Profile", click on it and tap "Install" on the upper right corner. 7. After your iPhone is done installing the profile configuration, you will be prompted to restart your device. 8. After restarting your iPhone, go to Settings > General > Software Update and check if iOS 14 Developer Beta is already available for download and installation. If you don't see it, just refresh the page or restart your iPhone. 9. Once you see it, just click on the "Download and Install" button. The entire firmware upgrade weighs around 4.13GB so you will need a fast and unlimited internet connection to download it quickly. After downloading all the files, just install iOS 14 Beta as you would on previous iOS updates that you've gotten used to on your iPhone. 10. Your iPhone will automatically restart to wrap up the iOS 14 Developer Beta installation and after which, you should be able to enjoy the latest iOS version on your beloved handset. If you're using a Mac, you need to install either Xcode beta or MobileDevice.pkg, which can be extracted from Xcode beta (two-finger tap or right-click on Xcode beta in the Applications folder; then select Show Package Contents > Contents > Resources > Packages > MobileDevice.pkg - this will work on older Macs that do not support the latest macOS or Xcode beta). Xcode beta can be downloaded from the Apple Developer website using your free Apple ID account. Step 4: Launch iTunes or Finder Once your device is connected, launch iTunes (Windows) or Finder (Mac) to prepare for the installation process. Step 5: Put Your Device in Recovery Mode To proceed, you will need to put your device in recovery mode. The steps to enter recovery mode differ depending on the model of your device. Here's how it's done: For iPhone 8 and later models: Press and release the volume up button. Press and release the volume down button.
