Game testers are responsible for identifying various issues within a game, including program bugs, spelling errors, graphical and audio glitches, and even potential copyright concerns. They need to carefully document their findings using software quality management systems to ensure accurate tracking and resolution of identified issues. It's important to note that game testing often involves repetitive gameplay of specific segments to ensure thorough bug identification and resolution. There are two typical game tester roles: Play testers. This job role focuses on user experience of a game including how fun the game is, whether it becomes boring or hard to understand, how many wins you can achieve as you progress and more. Quality assurance testers. This role focuses on identifying technical issues within the game such as inconsistencies, bugs and glitches. The 4-Part Game Tester Process Alongside playing games, game testers may be asked to perform a range of tasks to identify different problems. This might include downloading other games while playing one game, playing the game on different devices and in different browsers and switching the game on and off. Also, game testers are often asked to participate in multiple testing rounds, such as: Gross play testing. This is the initial test phase often performed by the design team. In-house play testing. A deeper test to find any remaining glitches, is usually performed by remote game testers or in-house game testers. Blind testing. This is undertaken with gamers with no prior knowledge of the game and they're asked to give experience feedback. Final testing. The final test before the game is released to the public. This is mainly to improve the game design and look as it should be functioning well now.
