How To Start Over In WordPress: A Step-by-Step Guide If you want to change the look and feel of your WordPress website or start from scratch, our experts recommend taking these steps. You might be tempted to reset WordPress in the hopes of solving all your problems, but sometimes it's not necessary. In this post, I'll cover scenarios where you might need to start again and help you identify if that's really what you need to do. If so, I'll show you how to reset WordPress. If not, I'll guide you on what the more appropriate course of action is. Maybe you've outgrown your domain name or want to rebrand your site. You can simply register a new domain and have it point at your existing site. To do this, register your new domain elsewhere and use Kinsta's DNS option in your dashboard. Wait for about two hours for the DNS settings to propagate across the internet. U can now start creatin new contnt all over again WordPress Theme Development: Staging and Backup Options for Easier Testing Save the downloaded zip file somewhere you can easily access it, then return to your WordPress site's themes or plugins screen. Select the theme or plugin you want to replace and click the "Add New" button. Click the "Upload Plugin" or "Upload Theme" button, select the zip file, and upload it. Confirm that you want to replace the existing version of the plugin/theme on your site, then activate it. That's it! You've successfully installed an older version of the theme or plugin. However, a notice will appear in the Plugins or Themes screen telling you that this version needs to be updated. Ignore this for now and wait until another update is available that fixes any issues you're experiencing. For more detailed steps on installing a WordPress plugin, check out our tutorial. To reset your entire WordPress site, delete it entirely and start fresh. This method should only be used if necessary, as it will erase all of your content and settings. Before proceeding, make sure to export any important content from the old site using the Import/Export tool or the Widget Importer & Exporter plugin. You can also use these tools to import your content into a new site if you want to migrate everything seamlessly. Alternatively, you can simply delete the old site through the Kinsta dashboard. Go to the Sites screen, select the site you want to delete, and click the "Delete site" button. Confirm that you understand what you're doing and agree to proceed with deletion. Once your site is deleted, create a new one in the Kinsta dashboard by clicking the "Add site" button. Follow the on-screen instructions to add details for your new site, then start setting it up using the WordPress admin screens. Install any necessary themes and plugins and configure them as needed. You can also import content from your old site to save time. To reset WordPress: In the admin menu, go to Tools > Import, then Install Now and Run Importer. Find the export file from your old site, upload it, and select your account for association. Wait for import completion, then check your Posts section. If you also exported widget settings, install the Widget Importer & Exporter plugin to import them. Customize and configure plugins as needed. For WordPress Multisite networks, there are two scenarios: resetting the entire network or a single site. To reset the network, take a backup, remove all sites except the base one, turn off Multisite, and edit the wp-config.php file to remove Multisite code. ##### Removing Multisite Sites and Networks in WordPress When you want to remove sites from your Multisite network, you should consider deleting only those you have added it to rather than removing Multisite altogether. To delete a site from Multisite first take a backup of the whole network. Then export or migrate that site if you wish to retain its content. Next navigate to Network Admin > Sites and for each site, click on Delete link. You can then have an (almost) empty Multisite network with just the base site left intact and ready for adding new sites. You could also reset your entire WordPress installation including Multisite and delete not only subsides but also the base site from this process. Be sure to move any of those you want to re-locate first. Resetting a single site within a Multisite network lets the person manage that one site by either deleting it or removing its content. To completely remove the site you will need the permission given to you as the Network Administrator only. If you're not ready to delete everything and start from scratch, but rather want to refresh your WordPress site's design or content, this might be the solution for you. In this post, we'll explore various methods for resetting WordPress and cleaning up your website. The approach will depend on why you need to reset your site, ranging from a minor operation like deleting posts and pages to completely removing the installation and replacing it with a new one. Before resetting WordPress, make sure you understand why you're doing so, as this will help you choose the right method and avoid creating extra work or losing valuable data. **Reset Your WordPress Site** As a WordPress site owner, you might encounter situations where you want to start from scratch - just like wiping your phone clean and starting over. Rather than deleting WordPress and reinstalling it from scratch, which is time-consuming, why not hit the reset button instead? Restarting or resetting your WordPress site means deleting all existing settings and customizations, restoring default settings without having to reinvent the wheel. This process isn't as complex as it seems at first. There are several ways to get your WordPress site back to its original state. However, before we dive in, let's explore when you might need to fully or partially reset your WordPress site. To use the free version, install and activate the plugin, then follow these steps: navigate to Tools => WP Reset, type "reset" in the box, click Reset Site button, confirm the reset, and deactivate all themes and plugins if desired. Alternatively, you can manually reset WordPress using WP-CLI or cPanel. To reset using WP-CLI, use commands like wp site empty to truncate posts and comments, and \$wp db reset --yes to remove tables from the database. For manual resetting through cPanel, access your old MySQL database, delete it, create a new one with the same name, add an old user to the new database, and update your wp-config.php file accordingly. 1. Create a new database and access WordPress credentials via the wp-config.php file. 2. Clear out leftover files from your site by deleting the contents of the wp-content folder in your FTP client. 3. Re-run the WordPress installation script through your browser to complete the reset process. For WordPress Multisite networks, two scenarios exist: - For network administrators, revert to a standalone installation by removing subsites and disabling Multisite. - For site administrators with access to multiple subsites, follow the same manual reset process for each site. To successfully reset a WordPress site, it is recommended to backup your data first.
