[=do you think it is possible that he is still alive?] I don't think he can still be alive. [=I think he must be dead] These problems can be dealt with more easily at the local level. You can't always get what you want in life. At this time of year many birds can be found on the island. [=there are many birds on the island at this time of year] If you don't tell me what the problem is, I can't help you. You can't be very smart [=you aren't very smart] if you believe that! He was supposed to be here an hour ago. Where can he (possibly) be? [=I want the biggest cake possible] They seemed as happy as can be [=they seemed extremely happy] when I last saw them. b — used in speech to express surprise or disbelief You must be joking! You can't/cannot (possibly) be serious! He can't really have meant that. [=I don't believe that he meant that] You can't (possibly) believe that! The price is \$50? That can't be right. [=that must be wrong] 4 a : to have permission to (do something) You can do it tomorrow if you like. "Can I leave now?" "No, you can't." You can't leave until you finish washing the dishes. — compare may 4 5 a — used to say what should or should not be done You can't leave now! The party is just getting started! Why can't you be more polite? [=you should be more polite; why aren't you more polite?] b — used in angry speech to tell someone to do something If you don't like it here, you can just leave! 6 a — used to describe the way a person sometimes behaves She can be very rude at times. [=she is sometimes very rude] b — used to describe something that sometimes or often happens In this part of the country the weather can change quickly. [=the weather often changes quickly] Usage Could is used as the past tense of can to describe an ability that someone had in the past or to say that something was possible in the past. I could run fast when I was young, but I can't run fast now. It used to be that you could drive for miles here without seeing another person, but now there are houses and people everywhere. To describe a specific occurrence in the past, use was/were able to instead of could. By working long hours, we were able to finish the project on time. In the future tense, will be able to is used. If you keep practicing, you'll be able to play the piano someday. She believes that someday people will be able to vote at home on their computers. Can can be used to suggest something that might happen in the future. If we save enough money, we can go to Hawaii for our vacation next year. no can do informal + humorous — used in speech to say that you cannot do something that you have been asked or told to do "Can you give me a ride to work tomorrow?" "Can" is an auxiliary verb ( modal auxiliary verb ). It can be used to express:AbilityPossibilityPermissionRequestOffer General Structure of "CAN" in a SentencePOSITIVE FORM (+) . It is used in a question, which is not a real question, to ask somebody to do something. We want somebody to do our request ( in an informal way, especially between friends or family ). ( Informal Request )Examples:Can you make me coffee?Can you hand me the pen?Can I have some tea, please?4. It is also used to ask or give permission for something. ( Informal Permission )Examples:Can I use your book, please? ( ask for permission )If you want, you can go to the park. ( give permission )Can I ask you some questions? ( ask for permission )You can drive my bike. ( give permission )5. It is used in offers to help someone or to do something for someone. ( Informal Offer )Examples:Can I help you?If they like, I can carry some bags for you.There is nothing left in the fridge. Can I do some shopping for you?Attention:For " CAN NOT ",1. It is used in negative saying ( when we are sure that something is not true or something is surprising )Examples:That can't be John. He is in America.It can't be raining. The sun is shining and there are no rain clouds.You can't be 50! You look young.2. "Can" is a modal auxiliary verb and it is used to indicate abilities, to make requests, to indicate probability, or to give permissions. It is one of the auxiliary verbs called "modal verbs" in English. It does not change according to the subjects. So there is no different situation for "He, she, it". The verb that follows is always infinitive, so it is very easy to use "can" in English conversations. ● Formation of modal "can" To make affirmative sentences we use "can + verb". For negative sentences we use "cannot" or "can't". For questions we put the auxiliary "can" before the subject. The following animated sentences are examples of "can" so that you can see them in context. Alex can swimcan runruncan not run rundrive fast ● Positive (Affirmative) form of "can" To form positive sentences just use a bare for of a verb after "can". I can swim. They can watch TV. Linda can play chess. My friends can play football. ● Negative form of "can" To make negative sentences with "can" we use "not" together with "can". The short form is "can't" I can't sleep well. Nancy can't understand the teacher. Cats can't fly. She can't keep secrets. ● Interrogative form of "can" To make questions (interrogative) with "can" we put "can" before the subject. Can you play basketball? Can I open the window? Can I ask a question? Can I help you? Where can I go for holiday? I can come with you. Can they win the game? We can stay at home. I can arrive at about 6 PM. What do you think? Can I get 100 points? ● 3- Permission To give permission or to ask for permission we can use "can", as well. OK. You can go. Excuse me. Can I sit here? Can I ask a question? Can I come in? ● 4- Requests Can I have a coffee, please? Can you help me, please?
