Cornell University is a renowned institution with a rich history dating back to its founding on April 27, 1865. Initially supported by Ezra Cornell and Andrew Dickson White, the university has grown to become one of the world's leading research institutions. The main campus in Ithaca spans an impressive 745 acres, boasting a strong reputation that has attracted numerous Nobel laureates, Turing Award winners, and Fields Medalists. With over 250,000 living alumni, Cornell counts individuals who have made significant contributions in various fields, including Marshall Scholars, Rhodes Scholars, Truman Scholars, Olympic medalists, Fortune 500 CEOs, and billionaires. The university's founders, Ezra Cornell and Andrew Dickson White, played a crucial role in its establishment as New York's land-grant institution. The initial campus site was provided by Ezra Cornell, who also contributed \$500,000 to the endowment. Andrew Dickson White served as the first president of the university, overseeing its early development and recruitment efforts. Throughout its history, Cornell has demonstrated a commitment to innovation and academic research. In 1883, it became one of the first electrified universities, using a water-powered dynamo to light parts of the campus. Since then, the institution has continued to evolve, incorporating state-funded colleges that fulfill statutory requirements and administering research and extension programs jointly funded by New York State and the U.S. federal government. The university has also been at the forefront of promoting literary societies and oratory skills. Willard Straight Hall, a prominent building on campus, played a significant role in the anti-Vietnam War protests in 1969, leading to the resignation of James Alfred Perkins, Cornell's seventh president. In 1967, a tragic fire occurred in the Residential Club dormitory, claiming the lives of eight students and one professor. This incident was part of the tumultuous late 1960s at Cornell, which also saw heightened activism on campus. Cornell University has a long history of activism, particularly in the late 1960s when protests against the Vietnam War led to a major governance overhaul. The university's strong academic programs have earned it top rankings globally since the 20th century, including sixth-best PhD programs in 1995 according to the National Research Council. Individual departments such as astrophysics, computer science, and ecology also ranked among the top ten nationwide. In recent years, Cornell has expanded its international presence by establishing a medical college in Qatar and developing partnerships with institutions in India, China, and Singapore. The university has also been at the forefront of higher education, with initiatives like the Bridging the Rift Center on the Israel-Jordan border. Cornell's strong reputation extends to its faculty, with the College of Arts and Humanities ranked fifth-best nationally and the Mathematics and Physical Sciences faculty sixth-best. The university's engineering program is also highly regarded, ranking fifth-best in the nation. With a growing international profile, Cornell has been described as a "transnational university" by former President Jeffrey S. Lehman. Despite its strong reputation, Cornell has faced challenges from graduate student unionization efforts, with the At What Cost? group instrumental in defeating a 2002 vote to unionize. The university's commitment to education and research continues to drive its growth and recognition as one of the world's top institutions. Cornell University's flagship campus is situated on East Hill in Ithaca, New York, offering breathtaking vistas of Cayuga Lake and the city. Spanning approximately 745 acres, the campus has evolved over time to incorporate multiple academic buildings, labs, administrative facilities, athletic centers, auditoriums, museums, and residential areas. Recognized as one of the most beautiful campuses in the US by Travel + Leisure in 2011, Cornell's Ithaca campus boasts a unique blend of architectural styles, historic landmarks, and picturesque surroundings. The campus's irregular layout and mix of architectural styles have developed over time, with more ornate buildings predating World War II and modernist structures emerging since then. Several buildings have been designated as National Historic Landmarks or listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Despite some demolitions in the 1980s, many historic buildings remain, including those on North Campus, which features primarily residential buildings designed to accommodate first and second-year students. The West Campus House System showcases a blend of architectural styles, while Colgegetown's diverse architecture reflects its mixed-use nature. Cornell University has a unique setting surrounded by Cayuga Lake, the city, and surrounding valleys. The campus itself is bordered by two picturesque gorges, Fall Creek Gorge and Cascadilla Gorge. These gorges are popular spots for swimming during warmer months but are discouraged due to safety hazards. Adjacent to the main campus lies the 2,800-acre Cornell Botanic Gardens, featuring a diverse array of plants, trees, and ponds. To promote sustainability and reduce its environmental impact, Cornell has implemented several green initiatives, including a gas-fired combined heat and power facility, an on-campus hydroelectric plant, and a lake source cooling system. In 2007, the Atkinson Center for Sustainability was established, with a major gift from alumnaus David R. Atkinson and his wife Patricia. This center continues to drive Cornell's efforts towards sustainability, including a commitment to achieving net carbon neutrality by 2035. Cornell is powered by six solar farms that provide 28 megawatts of power. The university is also developing an enhanced geothermal system called Earth Source Heating to meet its campus heating needs. In 2023, Cornell became the first university in the nation to commit to Kyoto Protocol emission reductions. Additionally, a concert held at Barton Hall raised \$3.1 million for MusiCares and the Cornell 2030 Project. Weill Cornell Medicine, Cornell's medical school, is located on the Upper East Side of Manhattan and shares administrative functions with Columbia University Medical Center. The Weill Cornell Graduate School of Medical Sciences is another division of Cornell's medical campus in New York City. Since 1927, Weill Cornell has been affiliated with NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, one of the nation's largest hospitals. Cornell University has multiple partnerships with prestigious institutions such as cancer centers, Rockefeller University, and the Hospital for Special Surgery, allowing faculty members to hold joint appointments. The university also collaborates with Weill Cornell, Rockefeller, and Memorial Sloan-Kettering through the Tri-Institutional MD-PhD Program, which is available to selected medical students. In 2011, Cornell partnered with Technion – Israel Institute of Technology in Haifa to establish a tech campus on Roosevelt Island in New York City, with a focus on increasing entrepreneurship and job growth in the technology sector. Construction began on the Cornell Tech campus in 2014, with Thom Mayne designing the first building for Morphosis Architects. The university maintains local offices in New York City for some of its service programs, including the Cornell Urban Scholars Program, which encourages students to pursue public service careers. Other initiatives include the College of Human Ecology and College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, which enable students to engage with local communities through gardening and building projects, as well as the School of Industrial and Labor Relations' Extension and Outreach Program, which provides workplace expertise to organizations. The Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar was inaugurated in September 2004 by Cornell University as its first international medical venture outside of the United States. Located within Education City near Doha, this four-year MD program mirrors the curriculum taught at Weill Cornell Medicine in New York City and offers a two-year pre-medical undergraduate program. The college's construction was partially funded by the Qatar Foundation, with \$750 million contributed for its development. A 350-bed Specialty Teaching Hospital is currently under construction near the medical college. In addition to educational initiatives, Cornell University operates various off-campus research facilities, such as the Shoals Marine Laboratory and the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, offering students unique learning opportunities and contributing to the university's research endeavors. Cornell also has a presence in Puerto Rico through its operation of the Arceibo Observatory until 2011, which featured the world's largest single-dish radio telescope. The university maintains several facilities dedicated to conservation and ecology, including the New York State Agricultural Experiment Station and various laboratories focused on biodiversity research in locations such as Punta Cana and the Peruvian Amazonia. Cornell University provides various programs such as study abroad, scholarships, and internships that enable students to gain experience and earn credits. The Capital Semester program offers an opportunity to intern in the New York State Legislature, while the Cornell in Washington program allows students to spend a semester in D.C. participating in research or internships. Additionally, the university's Laidlaw Scholars program provides funding for undergraduates conducting internationally focused research. Cornell operates a cooperative extension service with 56 offices across the state, offering programs such as agriculture and food systems, children and families, community and economic vitality, environment and natural resources, and nutrition and health. The university is also home to the Animal Health Diagnostic Center. Cornell University has a decentralized structure with its 16 colleges exercising autonomy in defining academic programs, admissions, advising, and other issues. The university offers online professional development and academic programs through Cornell and participates in land-grant, sea-grant, and space-grant programs. ## The Board of Trustees at Cornell University holds regular meetings four times a year, governed by the New York State Open Meetings Law. The university's charter designates one board member as the life trustee, who is the eldest living lineal descendant of Ezra Cornell. As of 2024, this position is held by Ezra Cornell himself, making him both the current and longest-serving life trustee, having served for 50 years. His daughter Katy Cornell is expected to succeed him in this role. Michael Kotlikoff began a two-year term as interim president on July 1, 2024, succeeding Martha E. Pollack. The university offers various programs across its seven undergraduate colleges and seven graduate schools, with all departments affiliated with at least one college. Students pursuing graduate degrees are enrolled in the Cornell University Graduate School. The four statutory colleges receive funding from SUNY for teaching, research, and service, while nine privately endowed colleges operate independently, granting them greater autonomy. In 2018, Cornell raised \$743 million in private donations, ranking third behind Harvard University and Stanford University.[115] Major single-donor contributions in recent decades have significantly shaped Cornell's professional schools. In 1998, Weill Cornell Medicine was renamed after a \$100 million gift from Sanford I. Weill, a 1955 alumnaus and former Citibank CEO. By 2013, the Weills' total donations exceeded \$600 million.[116] In 2017, Herbert Fisk Johnson III, an alumnaus and chairman of S. C. Johnson & Son, donated \$150 million to support the Samuel Curtis Johnson Graduate School of Management, one of the largest gifts to a business school.[117] Cornell Tech, the university's technology-focused graduate campus on Roosevelt Island, has received major philanthropic support. In 2011, Chuck Feeney, a 1956 alumnaus and founder of FCS Group, became Cornell's largest private donor, contributing \$1 billion to fund the campus and other initiatives.[118] In 2015, Irwin M. Jacobs, a 1956 alumnaus founder, and his wife, Joan, donated \$33 million to establish the Jacobs Technion-Cornell Institute at Cornell Tech. [119] Other major gifts have supported research and sustainability efforts. In fall 2022, Cornell's undergraduate programs for its Class of 2026 included 71,164 applications from which only 5,168, or 6.9% applicants, were accepted.[126] For enrolling freshmen, the middle 50% range of SAT scores were 700–760 for evidence-based reading and writing and 750–800 for mathematics, and the middle 50% range of the ACT composite score was 33–35.[125] The university attract a inclusive student body growth The proportion of admitted students who identify as underrepresented minorities increased to 34.2% in 2022, up from 33.7% in 2021, with 59.3% self-identify as students of color. Among the 5,168 admitted in 2022, 1,163 were first-generation college students. The university's need-blind admission policy ensures equal access to education for U.S. applicants, while a benefactor's charter guarantees admission without discrimination based on rank or locality. Cornell collaborates with other Ivy League institutions and has pledged to match financial aid offers from other schools, as well as introducing a financial aid initiative that replaced loans with scholarships. The university aims to meet the full financial aid needs of 40% full-time freshmen with financial need, with an average undergraduate student debt upon graduation of \$21,549. Qatar University trains medical professionals to enhance regional healthcare services. This initiative is part of the institution's efforts to improve health outcomes. The university is also collaborating with Israel, Jordan, and Stanford University to develop a comprehensive database of living organisms, dubbed the "Library of Life". This collaborative project aims to bridge knowledge gaps between nations. Qatar University has established partnerships with various international institutions for student and faculty exchanges, including universities in Italy, the UK, Japan, the Philippines, and India. These agreements facilitate cultural exchange and academic collaboration. Cornell University offers joint degree programs with partner institutions worldwide. Its Master's in International Management program is part of the Global Alliance in Management Education, allowing students to study at one of 34 participating universities. Cornell has a partnership with Queen's University in Ontario for an Executive MBA program, providing graduates with dual degrees from both institutions. Cornell University consistently ranks among the top academic institutions globally and domestically. In 2024, it was ranked 10th-best in the US and 12th-best worldwide by QS World University Rankings. The university excels in research, community service, social mobility, and sustainability. Cornell's architecture program has been ranked best in the nation by Design Intelligence for several periods. Its Master of Landscape Architecture and Bachelor of Science in Landscape Architecture programs have also received top national rankings. Cornell University's School of Management is a highly regarded institution, ranking among the top in the nation for salary potential. As a prominent research institution, Cornell is classified among "R1: Doctoral Universities – Very high research activity" institutions. The National Science Foundation ranked the university 14th in the United States for research expenditures in 2021, with \$1.18 billion invested. Additionally, Cornell ranks fourth globally for producing graduates pursuing PhDs in engineering or natural sciences at American institutions and fifth overall for graduates pursuing PhDs in any field.
